Advent Prayer Bags from Flame Creative Ministries

For each bag you will need:
A prayer sheet (click here to print https://drive.google.
com/file/d/1pyhOfOQF1V14CABhJWB2KQFgm5DJP4T/view),

a felt or paper star, a felt or paper heart, a pipe cleaner, a baby Jesus stone, a tea light candle, an organza drawstring bag (I used purple bags to reflect the liturgical season.)

First paint your baby Jesus stones. I used white and brown paint and a black paint marker (but a sharpie would probably work too). I also covered the finished painting with glossy mod podge. Varnish would work too, but this part isn't strictly necessary!

Next, fill your bags with one of each item and give them out! Keep in touch with your families if you can and see how the bags are working out :-)

Advent Prayer Bags

Prepare for Christmas with some special Advent prayers.

The people who walk in darkness will see a great light.

For those who live in a land of deep darkness, a light will shine. Isaiah 9:2



What do you hope for?

Light the candle and ask God to bring His light and hope to people who are finding life hard.



Love

Who do you love?

Hold the heart and say thank you to God for all the people you love and who love you.



Jou

What brings you joy?

Bend the pipe cleaner into a symbol for something that makes you happy. Ask God to help those who are sad to feel His joy.



The wise men followed the star to search for Jesus. Hold the star and pray for all those who are searching for peace in a troubled world.





Christmas Day

Make a special bed for your baby Jesus stone to lie in and light your candle again. Thank God for sending Jesus




to be a light in the darkness and trouble of the world. Pray that you will be a light in the darkness too.

Rev Elaine Murray, who is the Children's Ministry Network Representative for Cork, Cloyne and Ross Diocese shared a lovely tradition of putting the Wise Men at the back of the Church and slowly moving them closer to the crib where they arrive in time to worship Jesus. You can use the wise men from the Nativity scene, invite the children to paint Wise Men Peg dolls during Sunday Club and use a different three each week or you can opt to use knitted Wise Men, especially if it involves recruiting avid knitters from the congregation to help! You can add all sorts of adventures that they have on their journey. They can get trapped in a pew or have to scale down from a window or fall into the font! But nothing will stop them from following the star to bow down and worship their King.


