

<u>Present Aid launches new</u> ethical charity Christmas gifts

Christian Aid's ethical gift shop, has launched 18 new charity gifts for Christmas 2016. The new gifts will support some of the 65 million displaced people around the world, who have been victims of violence, conflict and unpredictability.

There are 10 gifts available for £20 or less, so your gift could provide a much-needed toilet (£8) for a community in South Sudan,; provide new boots (£10) to help a vulnerable child in Eastern Europe; or help send Malawian farmers a daily local weather forecast (£8) via text message so they know when it is best to plant seeds and harvest

crops.

To receive a Present Aid gift card by post in time for Christmas, orders must be placed by 14 December. Present Aid, has raised in excess of £17 million for Christian Aid's work with poor communities across Africa, Asia and Latin America.

The Challenges of Christmas

Christmas is a great time of year, but it's not without its challenges! One household had 250,000 Christmas lights, but could not boil a kettle for fear of blowing the system!

The challenge of over-indulging: We all remember the episode of the Vicar of Dibley, where she had to consume four Christmas dinners! Christmas is a time when we usually eat and drink far too much, the average person gaining 6 pounds in weight. But Christmas is not simply about gaining weight, but losing what weighs us down. 'Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you.' (1 Peter 5:7). Whatever your concerns or worries this Christmas, bring them to God.

The challenge of overspending: In the rush to buy Christmas cards, a woman bought a pack of 50 identical cards. Without reading the verse, she hastily signed and sent them off, but for one. A few days later she read the message: 'This card is just to say a little gift is on the way.' Christmas is not about getting into debt, but God getting us out of debt. He spent exactly what was needed on the first Christmas night: 'You are to give Him the name Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins.' (Matthew 1:21).

The challenge of over too quickly:

Christmas doesn't last very long, yet the effect of the first Christmas is long-lasting. 'For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.' (John 3:16). Jesus has come to bring us life in all its fullness, both for now and all eternity.

How do we face the challenges of Christmas? 'Yet what I can, I give Him - give my heart'.

lessons and SU groups. Within some of these assemblies I have been practising my puppeteering skills!!







NATIVITY PLAY



Interlock the 2 shapes by weaving the strips under and over their opposite




