Rev'd Dr Mike Ovey

Mike Ovey is the Principal of Oak Hill College, London.

Prior to ordination, Mike was a civil service lawyer who then trained for ministry at Ridley Hall, Cambridge. After his curacy, Mike taught at Moore Theological College, Sydney before moving to Oak Hill in 1998.

Mike's Bible Reading will set the stage for our thinking on Mission and the Local Church. Drawing from his growing experience of Anglicanism both locally and overseas, he will also guide our thoughts on Mission in a specifically Anglican context.



Rev'd Dr Heather Morris

Heather Morris currently serves as the Home Mission Secretary of the Irish Methodist Church.

Prior to ordination, Heather trained and worked as a speech therapist in Dublin. Since ordination she has served in both local Church and Academic settings. For nine years Heather taught at Edgehill Theological College where she developed and shared her particular interest in practical care and pastoral theology. In 2013 Heather was installed as President of the Methodist Church in Ireland for the customary one year.

Heather's focus upon on the pastoral mission of the Church and her concluding Address will be of great benefit to us as we consider and respond to the mission of the local church.
